#### An overview of the Fix The Digital Divide Fund

In 2023 we launched the Fix The Digital Fund as part of our commitment to support the hubs in The National Digital Inclusion Network. To shape the fund we used insight gathered from surveys and discussions with members of the network.

The fund currently offers four different grant types that allow a progression route through the grants.

- Digital Inclusion Activation Grant This is a one off £1,000 fund for new members of the National Digital Inclusion Network to establish their digital inclusion services (Activation Grant Round Two - Fix The Digital Divide -2023 to 2024 applications open from Tuesday 7th to Thursday 16th May 2024).
- The Digital Inclusion Capability Grant This is a £6,000 fund for members to add new or boost their current digital services (Capability Grant Round One Fix The Digital Divide 2024 to 2025 applications open Monday 29th April 2024 to Thursday 6th June 2024).
- The Digital Inclusion Impact Grant This is a £6,000 fund for members to reach and support more people in their community with data and digital skills support (Impact Grant Round One Fix The Digital Divide 2024 to 2025 applications open Monday 29th April 2024 to Thursday 6th June 2024).
- The Network Ambassador Grant This is a £10,000 fund for experienced members to support, represent and strengthen the Network through peer-to-peer activity (already underway).

We know that community intervention is the best way to reach people who are being excluded due to a lack of access or skills to use digital services and technology. When we heard that a lack of funding was a considerable barrier for Network members to support their communities with digital inclusion services, we revised our grant model to provide a clear and consistent offer for all Digital Inclusion Hubs. We feel the model will enable hubs to pick the funding opportunity

that best meets their needs, while helping us to grow and strengthen the network's delivery of digital inclusion support.

**Activation Grants** will allow us to support organisations new to delivering digital inclusion support, whilst our **Capability Grants** will provide an opportunity for slightly more experienced organisations to further develop their offering. The **Impact Grants** will then support organisations to reach and support some of the hardest to reach people across the UK.

Every Hub who receives one of the four grants will be encouraged, through facilitation by Good Things Foundation, to support each other and share best practice. This will be particularly useful if you're an organisation that's in receipt of an Activation Grant or a Digital Inclusion Capability Grant. More details will be provided about peer to peer support in the onboarding stages.

The Fix The Digital Divide Fund will allow Hubs to access flexible grants that meet their, and importantly their community's, needs. Together, we can fix the digital divide - for good.

This grant description and application guidance document has been recently updated for Hubs who want to apply for Capability Grants Round One - Fix The Digital Divide - 2024 to 2025 or Impact Grants Round One - Fix The Digital Divide - 2024 to 2025. The application process for the Digital Inclusion Capability and Digital Inclusion Impact Grants will also be open between Monday 29th April 2024 to Thursday 6th June 2024.

## Digital Inclusion Impact Grant - 2024 to 2025

#### Context and overview

The Impact Grant is for members of the network who are looking to secure funding to support people in their local community who lack essential digital skills and/or who don't have access to the internet. The grant will enable hubs to offer digital skills provision focused on building people's skills and confidence as well as help with access to the internet. There are two contracts available, £3,000 to support between 60 and 90 people, and £6,000 to support between 120 and 150 people. The method of support must be through Learn My Way and/or the National Databank. Applicants will be asked to indicate how many people will be supported as a result of this grant. Organisations who are supporting people with complex needs or who are based in a rural area may opt for the lower end of the range.

Successful applications will be innovative and creative. We are not looking to fund activity that is already happening without this funding. It must be a new idea, something that you don't already have the funding to try.

We're welcoming applications that focus on delivering support directly to people in the local community who need the help the most, including the hardest to reach. We anticipate that the grant money could be used to develop and deliver a programme of digital skills provision, including paying for staff resource or volunteer expenses, marketing materials and IT equipment, although this is not an exhaustive list.

#### Grant size and requirement

The grant size will be paid in two instalments. The details of these two instalments and what's required for them to be released can be found below.

	Take part in <b>two workshops</b> during the grant period, one which will be for you to provide an update, and one which will help us understand the legacy of your activity.
	Be willing to provide proof of delivery and proof of spending in line with our <b>quality assurance</b> measures.
	Complete <b>one survey following the grant period</b> to help us understand the long term impact of the grant and to capture your wider digital inclusion delivery.
	Be willing to host a visitor or speak with a member of our research team to help us further understand the impact of the Impact Grant.
	Be willing to <b>speak with the team managing the grant</b> to discuss your progress on an ad hoc basis as and when required.
	Be willing to <b>provide a testimonial based case study</b> about how the grant has benefitted your organisation.

Peer to peer support is a significant part of how we'll support grantees across the Fix The Digital Divide Fund. Grantees receiving the Impact Grant will be provided the opportunity to access support from one of our Network Ambassadors, or another experienced Digital Inclusion Hub. To create a sense of community across grantees we expect this to be something all successful applicants take advantage of. Grantees will also be encouraged to be active in the Network Facebook Group and to attend network meet-ups to share best practice in delivering digital inclusion support.

Payments will be made within the calendar months noted above. We'd like to bring to your attention two things when considering an application. Firstly, 50% of the grant is paid at the end of the grant period, so keep this in mind when planning activities and spending. Secondly, all successful grantees are asked to provide evidence that their bank details on our website match those of your organisation's bank account. Guidance on what is expected will be provided to successful grantees, but a delay in actioning this could lead to delays in your first payment. Grantees who have recently passed this check may not need to provide another bank statement.

#### **Eligibility Criteria**

To be eligible to apply organisations must already be a registered member of The National Digital Inclusion Network as of Friday 26th April 2024. Applications are welcome from organisations across the UK. Organisations who have received either a Digital Inclusion Impact Grant or a Digital Inclusion Capability Grant through Fix The Digital Divide 2023 to 2024 can still apply. Do please note if you have had an Impact Grant through Fix The Digital Divide – 2023 to 2024 previously your proposal must be to focus on something different, such as embedding Learn My Way if through the last grant you focused on the National Databank.

If you're intending to apply to join the network on behalf of your organisation before submitting an application, please ensure it isn't already a member. There are two ways you can check this. Many organisations are on our map. If you can't see your organisation here, please ask around your team members to see if anyone else has previously joined your organisation up. Registering a duplicate organisation may cause your application to be unsuccessful.

#### Applicants for a Impact Grant must also consider:

• Hubs can not apply for a Capability Grant and an Impact Grant from the Fix The Digital Divide Fund 2024 - 2025 at the same time. If a Hub applies for both grants at the same time we may discount both applications.

All organisations applying for this grant must pass an identity check and financial due diligence check. In most cases these can be undertaken without needing to speak to the organisation directly. However, from time to time we do need to gather further information, and responses to any emails regarding this would need to be responded to within five business days.

Contracts must be accepted online where Terms & Conditions specific to this grant will be provided. Terms and Conditions must be accepted and adhered to by Hubs and Good Things Foundation.

## Digital Inclusion Capability Grant - 2024 to 2025

#### Context and overview

The Capability Grant is for members of the network who want to secure funding to develop their organisation's capacity to deliver digital inclusion support.

Applicants must submit a realistic but ambitious proposal that would see them enhancing an existing provision or piloting something completely new. All proposals must have one of Good Things Foundation services, meaning Learn My Way or the National Databank, as a key component.

Based on previous rounds of capability grant funding, we have seen and supported this grant to be used in a variety of ways. Although not an exclusive list, applicants could use the grant to help build partnerships that allow them to distribute more data, refresh an IT suite which would then be used to provide Learn My Way classes, or create a training programme for staff and volunteers that would allow them to be fully confident in helping people get access to data and support.

We'd like to fund a variety of organisations across the UK. If demand is high, priority may be given to those who have not previously received any form of capability grant from us before.

#### Grant size and requirement

The £6,000 grant size will be paid in two instalments. The details of these two instalments and what's required for them to be released can be found below.

#### Requirements - £6,000 grant

- Complete a **Baseline Survey** within the first four to six weeks of the grant period, which will aim to understand where your organisation is prior to delivering your proposal.
- Complete an **Impact Survey** within the last four to six weeks of the grant period, which will aim to measure the distance travelled from before delivering

your proposal and capture your wider digital inclusion delivery.

- Take part in **two workshops** during the grant period, one which will be for you to provide an update, and one which will help us understand the legacy of your proposal.
- Be willing to answer further questions about your Baseline Survey, provide proof of delivery and proof of spending in line with our **quality assurance** measures.
- Be willing to **host a visitor or speak with a member of our research team** to help us further understand the impact of the Capability Grant.
- Be willing to **speak with the team managing the grant** to discuss your progress on an ad hoc basis as and when required.
- Be willing to **provide a testimonial based case study** about how the grant has benefitted your organisation.

Peer to peer support is a significant part of how we'll support grantees across the Fix The Digital Divide Fund. Grantees receiving the Capability Grant will be provided the opportunity to access support from one of our Network Ambassadors, or another experienced Digital Inclusion Hub. To create a sense of community across grantees we expect this to be something all successful applicants take advantage of. Guidance on what is expected will be provided to successful grantees, but a delay in actioning this could lead to delays in your first payment. Grantees who have recently passed this check may not need to provide another bank statement.
